Area E (Major Requirements)

MGA - AMGT 2301 Introduction to Logistics

Course Description for AMGT 2301: This course is designed to give an overview of logistics including critical elements and systems which drive accuracy and decision making at all levels of management

Lecture/Lab Hours: Three hours per week.

ATC – SCMA 1003 Introduction to Transportation & Logistics AND SCMA 2103 Supply Chain Management Concepts

Course Description for SCMA 1003: Businesses today cannot be competitive without a good transportation and logistics network. This course introduces the five basic forms of transportation and provides an understanding of the economic fundamentals underlying each mode. Students then discuss ways in which today's supply chain manager can use these transportation modes to achieve efficiencies and cost effectiveness necessary for a company to survive in today's global markets.

Lecture/Lab Hours: Three hours per week.

Course Description for SCMA 2103: Introduction and Supply Chain Management

MGA – AMGT 3114 Purchasing and Materials Management

Course Description for AMGT 3114: This course examines the processes and challenges involved in acquiring and controlling materials, and the operational areas of purchasing, materials management, inventory management, just-in-time (lean) purchasing, supplier selection and evaluation, total quality management, value analysis, legal issues, bargaining and negotiation, and global sourcing in supporting a professional procurement function.

Lecture/Lab Hours: Three hours per week.

ATC – SCMA 2105 Procurement Methodologies AND SCMA 2108 Global Sourcing

Course Description for SCMA 2105: This course teaches an overview of the procurement function in a

supply chain and a corporation. It covers the major elements of the procurement process and operation including sourcing principles, procurement policies, purchasing processes and systems, and

Course Description for SCMA 2108: This course provides an overview of how a company decides who to purchase goods and services from and the techniques they use to do so. It examines supplier selection

proprietorship. Topics include: accounting vocabulary and concepts, the accounting cycle for a personal service business, the accounting cycle for a merchandising business, inventory, cash control and

receivables. Laboratory work demonstrates those presented in class.

Lecture/Lab Hours: Four hours per week.

Course Description for ACCT 1105: Introduces intermediate financial accounting concepts that provide students with the necessary skills that are needed to maintain a set of books for a partnership and

corporation. Topics include: Fixed and Intangible Assets, Current and Long Term Liabilities (Notes

Payable), Payroll, Accounting for a Partnership, Accounting for a Corporation, Statement of Cash Flows, and Financial Statement Analysis. Laboratory work demonstrates the

Midwest Transfer Compact

Agreement Between the Midwest States of Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio, and Wisconsin

WHEREAS, the Midwest States of Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio, and Wisconsin have agreed to enter into a compact to assist and promote the transferability in the Midwest of credit earned in postsecondary education;

AND WHEREAS, the compact is necessary for the mutual benefit and interest of the people of the Midwest States;

College agree as follows:

1. **Purpose.** The purpose of this compact is to assist and promote the transferability in the Midwest of credit earned in postsecondary education.

2. **Parties.** The parties to this compact are the Midwest States of Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio, and Wisconsin.

3. **Definitions.**

(a) "Academic credit" means credit earned in postsecondary education that is transferable to another postsecondary institution in the Midwest.

(b) "Midwest State" means the State of Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio, or Wisconsin.

(c) "Postsecondary institution" means a college or university in the Midwest State.

4. **Transferability.**

(a) Each Midwest State shall ensure that credit earned in a postsecondary institution in that State is transferable to any other postsecondary institution in any other Midwest State.
