Terminal degree (PhD, EdD, etc.) in a relevant discipline such as sociology, public policy, nursing, health, natural sciences, history, business, urban planning, public health, education, etc.

Demonstrated record of research/scholarship related to community issues

Experience teaching courses or leading programs focused on civic/community engagement

Proven track record of successful community-based research projects

Established relationships and experience working with community organizations

Skills in facilitating community meetings, focus groups, charrettes, etc.

Commitment to principles of community-engaged scholarship

Openness to working across disciplines on complex community issues

Ability to connect siloed perspectives into holistic solutions

Experience leading or participating in interdisciplinary teams
