



A mobile app that IT had planned on purchasing was postponed another year due to cost concerns

- o Athletics Director budget passed on a voice vote
  - A new washer was budgeted as Middle Georgia's soil's stains are more difficult to clean than either of the washers available to Athletics
  - The travel budget was estimated, as we do not have post-season play information for the NIAA league
  - MGSC has requested an increase in Athletics fees to \$130
  - Budget originally submitted to the committee was short 50% of the athletic director's salary budget
- o Parking fee budget passed on a voice vote
  - Maintenance
- o Recreation & Wellness fee budget passed on a voice vote
  - 30-year lease
- o Student activity fee budget; a reduced budget passed on a voice vote
  - Brannon submitted an alternative budget to compensate for reduced revenue
  - Lively and spirited discussion to put together "the big numbers"
  - The committee were favored by a passionate and informed appeal by Chalfa, primarily on behalf of the MGSC arts community
  - The final budget was based on a conservative estimate of our budget rollover from the previous year
- o Health fee budget was affirmed
  - Two Nurse practitioners and associated student workers
  - Originally approved in December
- New Business
  - o Brannon: There is a need to amend the definition of sexual assault in the student handbook, as well as detail MGSC policies relating to it. Brannon proposed suitable language based on the Georgia Southern University handbook
  - o The handbook was amended on a voice vote
- Next meeting: a meeting may be necessary in September due to reduced enrollment and/or budget shortfalls
- Meeting adjourned at 11:07 am
