COURSE DESCRIPTION: Students perform respiratory care procedures in acute care areas and alternate sites with emphasis placed on patient assessment and basic care techniques. 8 hrs/wk x 7.5wks (2nd half of semester). Clinical Hours: 60 hours/ semester

- therapist daily evaluations


