DRESS CODE

*Lost clinical hours must be made up before student can complete this clinical level. If the student is

dismissed from the clinical site, permission from the facility must be obtained by the clinical director before the student may return. Failure to be readmitted to the clinical site will result in dismissal from the program, depending on the student's level and the clinical site involved.
