3. Review of Proposals

a. From School of Business

M-PY-BUSA-01-02-AA-2016-2017 (Policy Modification, MSM) Dr. Cantwell and Dr. Lopez explained that this aligns the program with other programs around the state and makes admission more flexible to help attract more students. Question: Essentially, this is geared toward people who already have an undergraduate degree? Answer: Yes. This is another pathway to meet the foundation requirements. Question: How much are the courses? Answer: Each course is \$75. First – Dr. Rigole; Second – Mr. Lowery. Approved.

b. From the School of Education

C-EDUC-34-37-AA-2016-2017 (Course Modification, Non-Gen Ed) Dr. Sartin explained that those changes align with new guidelines by the Georgia Professional Standards Commission. This was submitted to the state on February 1st and this was accepted without changes recommended while most other institutions usually have changes to make.

Question: Are there changes to the SLOs since there are changes to the course descriptions? Answer: Not really. Question: Is there field experience? Answer: There is experiential learning.

c. From the Department of English

P-ENGL-01--AA-2016-2017 (New Minor/Track/Certificate)

P-ENGL-02-AA-2016-2017 (Non-Sub Program Modification)

C-ENGL-01-05-AA-2016-2017 (New Course, Non-Gen Ed)

Dr. Rogers explained that all the proposals above revolve around the creation of a Minor in Professional Writing (P-01) and the courses the Minor consists of (C-01-05). The department has identified a need for such courses and a minor in the workplace. It

provides practical workplace skills for English majors but this is also a good standalone minor for students in other majors. Dr. Berke added that those courses were added to the curriculum of the B.A. in English (P-02) so that students can embed the minor in their program.

Dr. Rogers added that we need those classes because as we train students for writing, they learn how to write academic papers. These courses give them an introduction to other types of writing, especially professional writing and different requirements for writing business documents on various platforms (digital for instance). There is also a course focused on research for the workplace as opposed to library research. In addition, all of these classes have an emphasis on working collaboratively because this is what technical writers do.

e. From the Department of Media, Culture, and the Arts

C-MCA-13-14-AA-2016-2017 (New Course, Non-Gen Ed) Dr. McTyre explained that art faculty are developing an Art Concentration for the B. A. in IDS and there is a need for upper-level courses. These classes develop what students need in the art world by adding business courses to their curriculum. Question: Those courses state 2 lecture hours and 4 lab hours. Is that correct? Answer: Yes; lecture and lab hours are different from credit hours. Question: what are the fees for those courses? Answer: Standard fee is \$35 and this will have to be approved by USG. Question: Were fees submitted to Fiscal Affairs? No, they have not.

C-MCA-12-AA-2016-2017 (Course Deletion, Non-Gen Ed) Dr. McTyre explained that this course has not been taught at the consolidated institution and its sister course has already been deleted.
