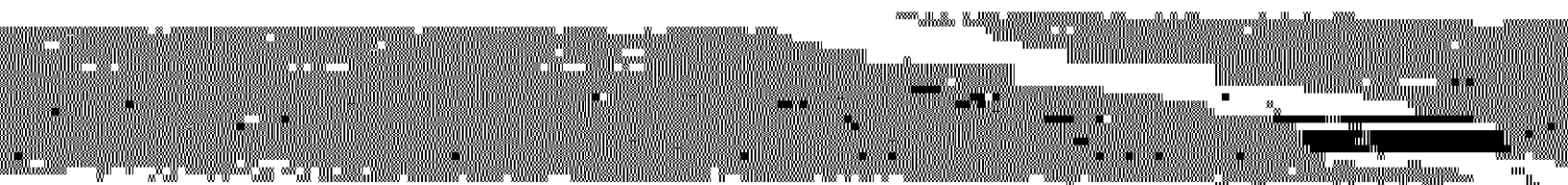
Current Course AVIA 3106 – Private Pilot Flight
