Our final draft for the new PTPTR evaluation will be submitted to the System Office by the end of May. It will be vetted and approved over the summer before coming back to the Senate in the fall. The new evaluation standards will go into effect in January of 2023.

We continue to make progress on our Academic Master Plan (AMP). The AMP will provide insight into the next few years. The AMP will highlight academic programs that are in the works, programs planned for expansion, student success efforts, accreditation and assessment, and a comprehensive look at how we continually measure our success. In its entirety, the plan is designed to further build campus identity and presence. The strategic initiatives that will be most important for Academic Affairs are FYS/FYE, advising, and learning support.

Dr. Pattillo asked if there was any thought/plan to rearrange or reorganize the schools again. Dr. Jenks replied, “in short, no.” If it were considered in the future, faculty, students, and staff would be involved.

Dr. Cantwell shared a draft copy of the calendar of the New Strategic Plan Development Process. In August we will begin a conversation in earnest about our strategic plan. It will focus on supporting students, retention, and faculty development. By September, an ad hoc strategic planning committee will be formed. Dr. Taylor asked about the difference between the ad hoc strategic planning committee and the Senate’s Strategic Plan Implementation and Assessment committee. There will be overlap between the two groups but a detailed conversation about the differences has yet to take place.

Dr. Cantwell noted this is the ten-year anniversary of shared governance of the Faculty Senate. He reminisced about the evolution of the Senate. He thanked Drs. Kilburn and Dubuisson for their current and future leadership of the Senate. Dr. Matson thanked Dr. Cantwell for the instrumental role he had in forming Faculty Senate. Dr. Kilburn explained that he has enjoyed
