To facilitate the rotation of the choices while maintaining availability to the student in terms of offerings (avoid bottleneck in advising). Answer offered (Mary Wearn): effectively scheduling was removing choice by reducing options due to scheduling/availability. This also supports the addition of new tracks/concentrations.

Question (Andrew Reeves): Do we have partners lined up for the internship? Answer (Benita Muth): Currently there are no existing arrangements in place, but graduate assistants are currently in place in paid positions in the writing center. Having an internship would support potential teachers in achieving credentialing. Also supports development of partnerships. Opportunities for graduate assistants on campus.
