# Appendix A— Proposal for amendment to Faculty Handbook 5.03.01 by Faculty Affairs Committee

Proposal for amendment to Faculty Handbook 5.03.01 by Faculty Affairs Committee Modification Proposed (proposed addition is underlined)

College of School Deans and Department chairs shall make an effort to assure fair and equitable assignment of teaching loads among their faculty, taking into account such factors as student load, number of preparations, contact hours, and travel time. Day and evening classes shall be part of the standard teaching load of faculty members at Middle Georgia State University. MGA's teaching load policy is 4 classes (12 semester hours) per semester for faculty with a terminal degree and 5 classes (15 semester hours) per semester for faculty without the terminal degree. MGA's teaching load policy is 5 classes (15 semester hours) per semester for lecturers regardless of degree status. For non-standard classes (laboratory, studio, field study, etc.), equivalent individual faculty workloads are determined within departments.
