## **Academic Affairs**

Dr. Reeves presented eight proposals from the Academic Affairs Commute Stines moved to discuss the proposals. Mr. Day seconded.

Associate of Science in Computer Science (new program) – Dr. Reeves mentioned that this was to support the Georgia Academy at the Warner Robins Campus. The new program was approved unanimously.

Bachelor of Science in Computer Science (new program). Reeves noted that this new program would also focus on the Warner Robins Campus. Dr. Taylor moved to allow guests to speak. Mr. Agnew seconded. There were no objections. Dior Tasked Dr. Neil Rigole, Chair of the Department of Information Technology, about the difference between a computer science degree and an information technology degree. Dr. Rigole responded that computer science is primarily focused on theory, mathdprogramming. Dr. Rhonda Amerson, Chair of the Department of Teacher Education, mentioned that there would be an education track that would allow a graduate with this degree to teach computer science. The new program was unanimously approved.

Master of Education in Curriculum and Instruction with a Focus in Literacy (new program) The new program passed without objection.

Minor in Education (new program) Dr. Lanning asked Dr. Reeves to display the curriculum sheet for this new program. Dr. Amerson mentioned that easle courses already offered. Studentsin this new minor will be eligible to receive teacher certification. Dr. Biek, Dean of the School of Education & Behavior Sciences, acknowledged the interest among many senators regarding themany waysto receive teacher certification. His school will create a summary explaining the numerous aysto receive teacher certification. The new program was unanimously approved.

Minor in Social Work (new program) The new program was unanimous proved. English (MATPW) (program modification) Dr. Reeves noted that this modification will provide more creative writing and online pedagogy options for students. Dr. Matalegridge asked if this will help students get jobs in technical writing. Benita Muth, Chair of the Department of English, and Dr. Monica Miller, Coordinator of Graduate Technical Writing Programs, explained that the greatest demand for technical writing is content creation. This modification will create a stackable degrprogram that will allow students to broaden their elective options. The modification passed with unanimous approval.

Certificate in Technical Writing and Digital Communication (program modification) modification passed with unanimous approval.

Master of Arts in Public Relations (program modifica)ierDr. Reeves noted that this modification is adding lab electives. The modification passed with unanimous approval.
