Call to Order and Approval of Minutes and Agenda

Dr. Dubuisson called the meeting to order at 10am. She welcomed the Senators to the last meeting of the academic year.

Report from Dr. Blake

Dr. Blake started his report with a reminder that he and the administration would like to see the Faculty at the upcoming graduation ceremonies, especially since the number of faculty seats has been recently increased.

Dr. Blake said that his report was largely some updates from the Trustees meeting last week. MGA has been doing well the past few years, and he is happy to see support levels shifting to MGA being a fully funded state university, at the same rate as the frame USG. Three years ago it cost \$113 per credit hour to attend MGAd as of this coming fall it will be \$174. All of the work of consolidation and achieving university status of the past twelve years is now being recognized as of last week. It was a bitof a hit when MGA lost special institutional fees four years ago because of how many online students we haved their fee structure at the timbert the new funding rules now put online student fees at 50% ofperson students. This is especially with recreation and wellness, including now that there is a charge for use of the Wellness facilities in Cochran as there has been in Macon for sommetia 7 K L V L V D O V R J R R G I R U D W K O H W L F V D towards joining the NCAA.

Dr. Blake concluded his remarks by saying he looks forward to a strong next academic year, and hopes that the current one ends well and that everyone finds time to celebrate commencement.
