2013-2014 Emergency Care Procedures Guide

The objective of the College is to place a sick or injured student, faculty, or staff member into the care of family, personal physician, or medical facility.

Daytime Emergencies

Monday through Thursday, 8:00 a.m. - 5:30 p.m.
Friday, 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

Life threatening emergencies:

(severe blood loss, symptoms of heart attack, stroke, etc.)

From a campus telephone and dial "9" for an outside line, and then dial "911" for an emergency operator. Public phones and call boxes are available on campus for use in an emergency.

Request a RESCUE UNIT and AMBULANCE be sent to the Middle Georgia State College entrance.

Call the Middle Georgia State College Police Department by dialing "9" and the appropriate campus number as indicated in the general information section. Advise the dispatcher of the situation and ask for a Police Officer to meet the ambulance and escort emergency personnel to victim. Patient will be transported to appropriate medical facility.

Non-life threatening emergencies:

From a campus phone, dial "9", then the appropriate campus police station and advise dispatcher of the situation.

Night Emergencies

Monday through Thursday, after 5:30 p.m.
Friday, after 12:00 p.m.
And weekends

Life threatening emergencies:

(severe blood loss, symptoms of heart attack, stroke, etc.)

From a campus telephone and dial "9" for an outside line, then dial "911" for an emergency operator. Public phones and call boxes are available on campus for use in an emergency.

Request a RESCUE UNIT and AMBULANCE be sent to the Middle Georgia State College entrance.
