



What is the Assessment and Care Team and why is it necessary?

Middle Georgia State College has in place appropriate crisis and emergency response procedures. However, in an era of increasing concern regarding the prevention of campus violence, the Ch

- x Lack of civility, respect for others;
- x Acting out and/or disruptive behavior;
- x Behavioral violations of the Student Code of Conduct;
- x Verbal or written indications of violent fantasy, intentions, past;
- x Participation in gang-related activity;
- x Recent contact with law enforcement
- x Mental health history related to dangerous behavior
- x Unusual interest in police, military, terrorist activities and materials; previous incidents of violence;
- x Fascination with weapons

Any behavioral concerns that have the potential to negatively impact the safety and wellbeing of the campus environment should be reported. Even when you are in doubt, for the continued safety and wellbeing of the campus community you should report.

What is my responsibility?

It is the responsibility of every member of the College community to provide a proper response to a situation which an individual or group of individuals is exhibiting behaviors that are considered to be

- (1) A life threatening emergency
- (2) A non-life threatening emergency
- (3) A behavior of concern.

1. A Life Threatening Emergency should immediately be reported to law enforcement and/or medical personnel by dialing "911." Also call the appropriate campus police station (See campus resources below). Police officers will escort medical personnel to the location.

For the safety of the campus community, consider any threat, explicit or implied, a statement of intent.

2. A Non-Life Threatening Emergency should be reported to the appropriate campus police station and the dispatcher should be advised of the situation.
3. A Behavior of Concern should be reported to the Behavioral Assessment Team by contacting the Office of Student Affairs or by contacting (phone/email) a Team member

What is the Team's responsibility?

The Team will meet as often and urgently as necessary to review reports brought forward by faculty, staff, and students regarding behaviors of concern. Immediate action include:

1. Student Conduct adjudication;
2. Placing the individual in the custody of the proper authority, parents, guardians;
3. Administrative Withdrawal;
4. On-going observation, defer action or decline action
